Over the past few months, EBP has been hard at work trying to develop rigorous standards for genomes that can be counted and applied towards EBP goals. See - <u>https://www.earthbiogenome.org/subcommittee-sample-collection-processing</u> This has been a thought-provoking exercise. As I've sat on the Data Analysis panel, it has been educational to view the development of these standards. If anyone is interested in joining these committees, we would welcome your time, and you can reach out to EBP.

Also, I would posit that GIGA can also establish our own standards and protocols.

For example, GIGA Secretary Kevin Kocot has begun to collate various protocols on the best SOP and protocols for collecting and preserving invertebrate tissue from various taxonomic groups. If you would like to contribute, please check out his request on the GIGA Slack channel "General". Please take a look when you can. Recommendations for genomics and sequencing standards are also welcome.

 The Biodiversity Genomics 2020 meeting from Hixton UK will move forward as planned on October 5-9, 2020 as an online conference. A formal announcement is in the works on the EBP website - <u>https://www.earthbiogenome.org/</u>. For now and from Mark Blaxter's email questionnaire, there were 22 respondents with 150 potential participants representing GIGA. Thanks for all your responses.

This promises to be another stimulating meeting, with over 1000 online attendees. Registration fees are still TBD, but will likely be minimal or free. There are still many details to be worked on the actual number of breakout sessions. For example, a virtual poster session is being considered. Each day will consist of 3 hour sessions to accommodate the most people from around world and their different time zones (e.g. sessions will run 10AM - 1 PM, New York time, which will also be 4 - 7 pm Greenwich time etc).

Similar to last year, the sessions will likely cover all EBP member groups such as GIGA, 10,000

plants, i5K, VGP, 1000 bat genomes, Catalan Genome project. Each group will be asked to host an inspiring roster of dynamic speakers. More information on the session list will be made available soon.

For now, Mark and the Biodiversity Genomics conference are looking for at least one VOLUNTEER from our GIGA COS, to be our representative on the overall conference committee (which will be choosing the plenary speakers, and will also have responsibility for some breakouts), and to propose plenary speakers - possibly in the area of conservation genomics or ecosystem genomics. It is possible this volunteer will also work with our GIGA Conference VP, Jean-François Flot. This can be coordinated later.

Subject areas we would like to highlight in the meeting, and where GIGA should have opinions and input, are

- Diversity and inclusion: evolutionary genomics has a particularly poor record in inclusion and diversity and we should face this

- Climate emergency: how do we engage and deliver to this existential threat

- Building biodiversity genomics in lower and middle income countries: supporting people in engaging society, building infrastructure and training scientists

Secondly this GIGA rep could lead or form a small committee to search for 2-3 speakers focused GIGA's invertebrate purview. The sessions can be themed/invited and/or open and up to the committee chair. GIGA GB members can assist or consult with the selection process if necessary.
